

Adam Hollingsworth is Chief Executive Officer of Parallel Infrastructure LLC. Based in Jacksonville, FL. He is responsible for managing the day-to-day operations of the company and its professional staff of real estate, telecommunications and public-private partnership development specialists. Parallel Infrastructure is expert in creating value from constrained real estate parcels, streamlining administrative processes and generating new revenue from lazy assets. The company's primary customers are railroads and public agencies seeking to generate new revenue from their rights-of-way and other real estate and non-core assets.

Prior to joining Parallel Infrastructure, Adam served as chief of staff to Jacksonville, FL Mayor John Peyton. In that role, Adam served as the senior-most appointed official in one of the nation's 15 largest cities. He was responsible for advancing the mayor's policy agenda, managing the mayor's senior team and working to meet the financial and operational needs of a diverse, urban community. Through the restructuring of city departments and divisions, Adam and the city's management team eliminated more than 700 positions across the non-public safety sector of the government – an 18 percent reduction. He also worked with department managers and private sector service providers to outsource functions across the government.

During the 2010 election cycle, Adam took a leave of absence from City Hall to work for the Republican Party of Florida in support of Rick Scott's successful bid to become Florida's 45th governor. He later served as a senior adviser to the governor-elect's transition team and led a wide-ranging review of state agencies.

Prior to joining Mayor Peyton's staff in October 2004, Adam was Vice President of Corporate Communications and Public Affairs for CSX Corporation. In addition to his nine years at CSX, Adam served as a vice president with APCO Worldwide and provided litigation communications counsel to a number of *Fortune 100* companies. Adam also served on the staffs of the late Jacksonville Mayor Ed Austin, the late Congressman Charles E. Bennett and Congresswoman Corrine Brown.

Adam graduated from Terry Parker High School in Jacksonville and is a member of the school's Hall of Fame. He earned a BA of Communications at the University of Alabama. Adam is on the board of Seamark Ranch. He was appointed earlier this year by Governor Scott to serve as a member of the Republican Party of Florida's Executive Committee and as a board member of Enterprise Florida, Inc. He is married to the former Amy Carrier of Coral Gables. They have two children, Hugh Michael and Haley, and are active members of Chets Creek Church.
